Door to door baseline survey of 4359 household done in by our team in 26 village in August September 2016. In this survey we found 4 deferent category of social group in village General 125, OBC 2778, SC 1445, ST 11. In this survey we found 433 never enrolled adolescent girls and 785 drop out adolescent girls.
