



## SWALAMBAN Project — Goat Support Summary

**Location:** Azamgarh District, Uttar Pradesh

**Implementing Agency:** ROSA SANSTHAN

### Project Overview

The “**Swavlamban**” Project aims to strengthen the livelihoods in the most marginalized families, particularly from the Musahar community. Goat rearing was selected as a livelihood intervention due to its low capital requirement, rapid reproduction cycle, and potential for steady cash income.

### Geographic Coverage

The intervention is concentrated in rural areas of Tarwa Block, covering villages including Basganv,



Devraypur, Gobardhanpur, Lokaipur, Rasepur, Saraytrilochan, and Sonvarsha. In these resource-constrained settings, goat rearing has emerged as a practical income-enhancement strategy.

### Key Achievements

- **Total beneficiaries:** 17
- **Initial herd size:** 26 goats
- **Current herd size:** 61 goats
- **Net herd growth:** +35 goats
- **Estimated current herd value:** ₹187,000
- **Average herd value per family:** ₹11,000

### Community-Cantered Approach

- **Participatory selection:** Families were involved in breed selection, fodder planning, and market linkage decisions.
- **Animal health access:** Regular vaccination and de-worming schedules coordinated with local para-veterinarians.
- **Herd growth support:** Availability of breeding bucks, improved housing/fencing, and interventions to increase kid survival rates.

### Operational Recommendations

1. **Health camps** combining vaccination, de-worming, and parasite checks.
2. **Breed improvement** through community buck stations for crossbreeding with high-yield breeds.
3. **Market integration** with collective transport and price information sharing.
4. **Monitoring & Evaluation** through family-wise herd registers and monthly tracking of births, deaths, sales, and vaccinations.

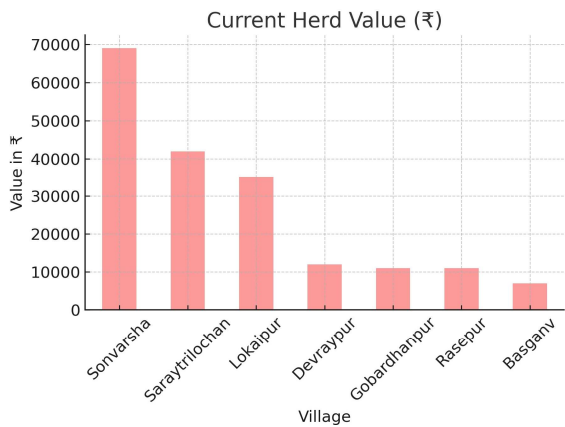
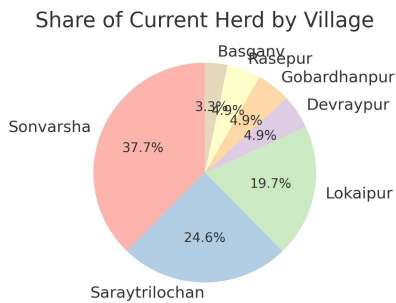
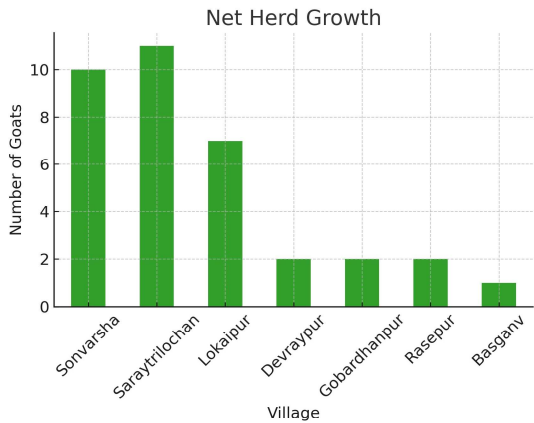
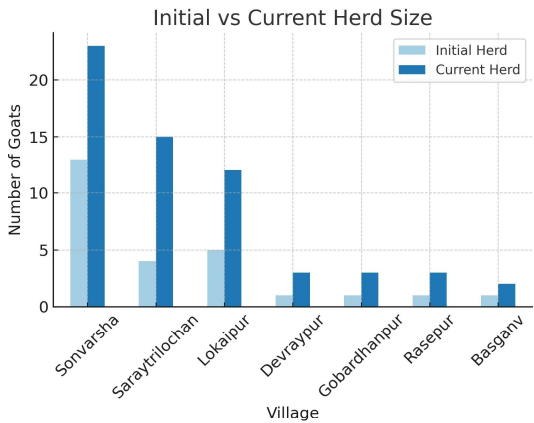
### Key Monitoring Indicators

- Kid survival rates and average herd size
